

Kitchens in the Vineyards

2008 Home Descriptions

Spring Street:

This sleek, modern kitchen was originally built in the 1980s by local architect, Josh Chandler, and was remodeled by the current owner this year. The exterior of this one-bedroom loft is reminiscent of a French countryside cottage while the interior is designed in a modern, industrial fashion. The home is outfitted throughout with energy-efficient, Solar Bronze windows and is surrounded by four gardens – each with a different theme.

Tubbs Lane:

This 19th century kitchen and private residence was completely renovated in 2006 by the current owners. The kitchen features a tin paneled, copper painted ceiling and solar tubing to provide natural light. The grounds feature Chinese inspired landscaping, weeping willows, native fauna and an excavated lake which is home to a variety of fish, swans and wildlife.

Silverado Trail:

This Mediterranean and Tuscan inspired kitchen features energy efficient windows and appliances. The interior of the home is filled entirely with rare, 16th and 17th century French antiques. The walls and ceilings are adorned with hand stenciled, French-inspired paintings and a mantel imported from France. The home construction features recycled wood beams lining the ceilings and recycled roof tiles for kitchen flooring.

Calistoga East:

This home features four seasonal kitchens all fashioned after the famous Parisian residence *Nissam de Camondo*. A crossover of French and Italian design, the residence holds nine French fireplaces, a pool, poolhouse and guest home. The back roofline is covered with 32 solar panels and the organic garden planted near the summer kitchen boasts varieties of vegetables and herbs.

Calistoga West:

This Neo-Tuscan kitchen features copper and concrete countertops and 100-year-old bleached oak flooring. This family home was designed and built for casual entertaining and boasts wide open spaces and incredible views of the surrounding forest-covered hills. The grounds feature 40-year-old Cabernet Sauvignon vineyards, 135-year-old olive trees and a vegetable garden interspersed with ornamentals.
